In the Bedford Borough area

First, identify the location of the problem. At the bottom of the page, use this link [Please click here to view the Rights of Way Online Mapping system](#)

When the map appears, pan and zoom towards the area where the problem occurred.

Click on the layers symbol (resembling a stack of sandwiches) on the left of the map and tick both OS parishes and Rights of Way.

Zoom in further until the Ordnance Survey Landranger mapping appears.

Make a note of the the parish.

Click on the path as close as possible to the location of the problem and make a note of the path type and number.

Pan the map until you see the bold blue numbers on the grid lines and make a note of the grid reference. (You may find it easier to do this on a paper Ordnance Survey Landranger map.)

First, identify the location of the problem. In the second paragraph, click on [online mapping system](#)

When the map appears, in the Map Categories layers, tick the Parish Boundaries box.

Pan and zoom towards the area where the problem occurred.

Click on the path on the map where the problem occurred and make a note of the path number, parish and type.

If possible, use an Ordnance Survey Landranger map and make a note of the grid reference.
